TRANSFORMATION STORY: ARTHUR

"I'VE GOT MY WHOLE LIFE AHEAD OF ME NOW."

fter years of drinking, Arthur's life was at a standstill. Unemployed, broke and homeless, he had lost everything he held dear. However, as a father of eight and grandfather to 12 children, the biggest loss was the respect of his family.

Determined to regain his family's trust, Arthur sought help at Union Gospel Mission of Tarrant County. "I went in with an open mind. I took a big leap of faith," he says. "I knew I was going to lose a bunch of friends, because I couldn't be a part of that lifestyle anymore. I had to surround myself with winners, people who are trying to make their lives better."

Since coming to UGM-TC, Arthur has definitely joined that group of winners. After a year in the the program, he graduated. He also earned his OSHA Forklift Certification through our training program.

"I got my whole life ahead of me now," Arthur says proudly. "I feel good." Not only does Arthur now have a solid job, a car and a place to live, he says, "I got new-found respect from my family. They've seen what I'm doing and they're happy for me. They are my motivation."



But, to Arthur, the biggest blessing was not in his own life, but his daughter's when she joined him at UGM-TC. "She saw what I was doing here and wanted to follow the path I'd chosen. She wanted her life to be better. And she brought my grandbaby with her."

Arthur is not only moving forward, he is "going full speed ahead. I didn't think I could do it, but I've accomplished so much. I praise UGM-TC. I'm so glad I came here and am thankful for the people I've met."

or 10 years, Deedra was stuck in a cycle of addiction, homelessness, recovery and relapse. "I felt really hopeless," she says. "I attempted suicide. I went to the hospital and I thought, 'I'm still alive. I've got to change my life. I've got to change the way I'm doing everything."

Deedra knew she couldn't do it on her own. She had been to Union Gospel Mission of Tarrant County before ... but this time, she was determined to move forward. The deciding factor in Deedra's recovery was turning her life over to God.

"I was baptized, and that was a beautiful event! Now I don't make any decisions without going to God first," Deedra tells us. "I know that Jesus is with me, that I am precious to Him. That has given me a whole new way to look at myself."

When Deedra looks at herself today, she sees a woman who respects herself and has strong values. "I feel successful. I went from having nothing, not even the will to live, to having a job, a safe home to live in, a place to celebrate my God. I couldn't ask for more than that," she says gratefully.

"I have everything in front of me to enjoy my life. I have joy that comes from within. I'm ready for



the next chapter. I don't know where I would be without UGM-TC. I'm very blessed."

When we asked Deedra to share her story she said, "This is the first time someone looked at me as a success. I tell the story, but God gets the glory!"

TRANSFORMATION STORY: ALISHA

"I WANT MY CHILDREN TO HAVE OPPORTUNITIES."

Iisha and her children needed a new start, so they left Arkansas and came to Texas. At first they stayed with Alisha's godmother. But traumatic circumstances forced them out. For two months the five of them shared a small hotel room.

Life greatly improved when they came to Union Gospel Mission of Tarrant County. "At first, I went through what any mom would go through," Alisha admits. "This was my first time in a shelter. I felt guilty and depressed. But there was nothing for my children back in Arkansas. I want them to have opportunities. And they need stability."

Feeling safe, they started to build a new life. With help from her case worker, Alisha replaced her children's essential records left behind in Arkansas. She also took parenting classes.

Above all, Alisha enjoyed refreshing her relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in Alpha class.

Alisha tells us her children have also grown in their love for the Lord – and for one another. "They have grown closer. They pray together,"



she says. "Every night, I'm just grateful to have them all there and pray with them."

Today, Alisha looks toward a brighter future for her family. They have recently moved into a place of their own. Currently working in a nursing home, Alisha plans to become certified as a Licensed Practical Nurse with a track toward becoming a Registered Nurse. In the meantime, she wants to be a Peer Recovery Support Specialist, so she can encourage people going through tough times and help them move forward, just as you helped her.

reg and Debbie Blackwell started serving meals at the Mission 15 years ago. Then Debbie was asked to head up the single women's and family Alpha programs. She now coordinates and organizes volunteers for Alpha – and Greg, an Alpha leader, is one of them.



The Blackwells find great reward in spending time with residents. Debbie says, "It's an opportunity to see what God is doing in their lives. You get to witness the transformation as He works on their hearts."

Asked about leading small groups in Alpha, Greg says, "To be able to play a role in someone's recovery and spiritual development is the most satisfying thing you could hope for."

Both Greg and Debbie have made deep and lasting friendships through Alpha. "We think we're serving them, but it's really mutual," Debbie says. "It's encouraging and faithbuilding."

To anyone thinking about lending a hand at UGM-TC, Greg says, "Quit thinking and do it!"

In 2023, 960 volunteers contributed 16,389 hours of time.

HEALING SHEPHERD CLINIC

omeless men, women and even children are frequently exposed to harsh weather, malnutrition, disease and lack of sanitation. Many are unaware they have chronic health conditions like diabetes, heart disease or mental illness. Since 2008, the Healing Shepherd Clinic has provided education, preventative care and medical treatment to homeless individuals in a climate of compassion and dignity.

Our services are the first stop for residents experiencing a health issue, keeping emergency rooms clear. With your help, Healing Shepherd Clinic cares for the mental, physical and spiritual well-being of our residents and guests.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH CENTER

ast October, we dedicated our new Community Outreach Center. Featuring a state-of-the-art training facility, fulfillment center warehouse, distribution center and the Carl R. Brumley Community Room, the COC helps individuals qualify for better-paying jobs that will sustain themselves and their families.

In addition to job training, the COC offers case management and other services to help men and women transition permanently out of poverty.


Daley Miller, development director for the COC, says, "It's not just about getting someone

certification and a job. It's about making them a rising person and removing all the barriers to their success."








WHERE YOUR DONATIONS GO
